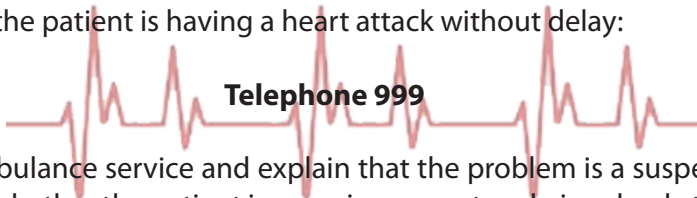


The Woodham Walter community defibrillator is now fully commissioned and operational.

- **It is located in the former telephone kiosk in the Street.** Outside Tadpoles CM9 6RF, opposite the Queen Victoria Public House.
- **It is available for use by anyone in an emergency whether trained or not.**
- **There are 23 trained operatives spread out all over the Village willing to help in an emergency.**

In An Emergency

If you suspect the patient is having a heart attack without delay:



Ask for the ambulance service and explain that the problem is a suspected heart attack stating whether the patient is conscious or not and give clearly the address of the premises.

The operator will give you a code to unlock the defibrillator from its housing to enable it to be used.

If the patient is unconscious immediately apply CPR (Cardiopulmonary resuscitation) and send a friend or neighbour for the defibrillator. If the patient is conscious place them in the recovery position and await the ambulance.

A system will soon be in place to automatically alert the nearest operator with the information to attend the incident.

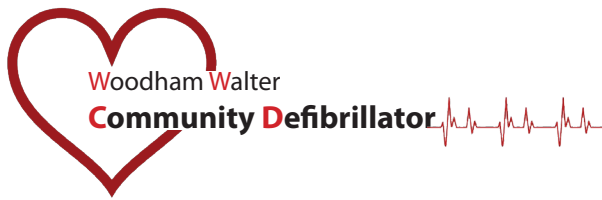
